This time we looked back at successful school trips, a wonderful school play, and from an academic point of view some very good end of year results in our SAT's.

As governors we spend time within the first FGB meeting setting our priorities for the coming year. These are generally linked to the school's own identified targets as well as areas we feel important or beneficial to the school to progress



This month we were looking at funny books and then created our own limericks.


This one is by Scarlett ...



We interviewed Y4's new TA, Mrs Porter Here are some questions we asked her...






Q. How young are you?



Here at LMPS, we often state how proud we are of our children and Scott Rowles has made us prouder than ever with his amazing achievements!

Scott is a member of the Poole Cycle Speedway Club. He trains hard two nights per week and participates in competitions most weekends. which are held at various locations around the country. 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Dear Sir/Madam

I am writing to let you know how impressed I am with one of your students.

In 2015 at the tender age of four, my little boy Shaun was diagnosed with a brain tumour. This obviously came as a great shock to me and the rest of his family, but thankfully Shaun is currently doing okay, the support of those around us has been invaluable. Since his diagnosis we have been fundraising for the brain tumour charity in many ways but Shaun's friends all wanted to show their support, so we enlisted a lane in the Wareham Lions Swimarathon (as previously done in 2015 raising over £800 and winning the Endeavour Award), Willow was one of the first to volunteer for the second year in a row! Despite the majority of the team being Sandford students, she quickly integrated and took part in supporting all of the other children the team. Many people commented on how wonderful the team spirit was and how all the children worked together so fantastically. This year we raised around £1100 a figure that is still rising, to which all the children contributed fantastically but Willow shone out as raising one of highest amounts £200 approx. Shaun is currently well but faces many difficulties and he certainly takes a lot of strength from how much others show they care.

You should be extremely proud of Willow's conduct in the event and I send my heartfelt thanks to her.

To make an application for Free School Meals (FSM), please ring 01305 251000.


You will be asked your name, date of birth, national insurance number and your child's name, date of birth and address.

£100 Allowance

Any child that is entitled to free school meals via pupil premium, (i.e. in receipt of free meals because you are in receipt of benefits), can now claim £100 per school year to use towards costs related to their child's education. This funding can be

used for items such as school uniform and educational school trips/experiences like swimming for example. In order for you to claim part or all of your £100 allowance, please speak to the school office, or contact Mr France or Mrs Dominey.
