Another busy year has started in music at LMPS. Once again we have a very large number of pupils learning to play musical instruments. Setting up the lessons is always something of a challenge, so thank you to all the parents for your patience and support while we have ironed out some of the wrinkles! Most instrumental lessons are now full, but if your child is interested in learning to play, please contact the office or Miss Wells for a form and your child can be put on the relevant waiting list.

Class music lessons are as lively as ever and it is just wonderful to see the children embracing all that music has to offer. Year 5 have been exploring leitmotifs, using triple time and the pentatonic scale to represent a Greek God or Goddess -ask them to tell you all about it! Year 4 have been looking at how weather can be represented through music, with a focus on dynamics - particularly relevant at this time of year with the range of weather we have seen! Year 3 have been taking part in the Musicianship Programme - please see the separate article. Year 2 have been singing songs and creating music based on the Great Fire of London. Ask them to tell you about what pitch is!

On a Tuesday and Thursday afternoon, the school is alive with the sound of singing as KS1 and KS2 choirs run. There are engagements being lined up already for both choirs, giving them the opportunity
to go and sing in the community, which fantastic. Both choirs are currently full, but, again, if your child is interested in joining, please let Miss Wells (KS2), Miss Barker (KS1) or the office know and the child can be put on the waiting list.

## Year 3 Musicianship Programme

As parents of Year 3 children are probably aware, they are currently taking part in the Musicianship Programme, run by Dorset Music Service and funded by the Arts Council. The children are learning to play the violin - not the easiest of instruments to get to grips with, but they are listening really well and showing great enthusiasm. At the moment, the children are learning how to hold the instrument and bow, which is harder than it looks! They have played some pieces on open strings, including Shotgun by George Ezra, which they really enjoyed. If they want to have a go on that at home, the notes are AAAA, DDDD, AAAA, GGGG - all open strings.

Encouraging your child to practise their instrument when they bring it home will make a huge difference to the progress they make and the enjoyment they can get out of playing their violin.

At the end of the programme, the Year 3 children will put on a concert to parents and friends in the school hall. It will be on Wednesday 4th December. A letter will go home nearer the time confirming the start time.

## Reading into WRiting

We have started a new writing process here at LMPS, Reading into Writing, where we are providing the children with a range of writing opportunitiesfrom guided and shared writing, to independent extended writing opportunities-all based around a specific text or film.

The children will experience writing for a range of purposes both fiction and non-fiction whilst also focussing on the relevant writing skills objectives for their year group. Writing tasks are often linked to various texts, sometimes to the whole class reading texts, films or topicsenabling children to write for a range of audiences.

This Reading into Writing journey encourages the children

to experience a whole text, where they can fully immerse themselves in the text to demonstrate concrete understanding.

From Year 1, the children are encouraged to be independent when writing an extended piece of writing. Children are also encouraged to self-edit and up-level their writing.

We have an exciting 'Wanderful (Wonderful) Wall of Writing' (Magically inspired as a play on words from Harry Potter), where children who produce an inspiring piece of writing can share and celebrate their writing master piece with the school!

Other times children were injured and even killed in the factories, mines and chimneys. Fortunately, there good men and women who fought to change the laws and stop child labour. Lord Shaftesbury was a famous reformer who visited the places children work and wrote reports for Parliament. He helped to change the laws and established schools for poor children. We learnt so much during our drama day but we also had great fun!
